## Strive For Five

As we launch into a new year, Bella Care Hospice is moving full speed ahead with our “Strive For Five” program. Strive For Five is a program that was developed after the CMS ruling to start publicly reporting the CAHPS Hospice Survey Star Ratings. Starting in August 2022, consumers are now be able to log onto the Medicare Care Compare website, and view the Star Ratings for hospices, just like you can for nursing facilities and other health care entities. Bella Care Hospice’s mission has always been to “provide superior health, social, emotional and spiritual services”. And while the Star Rating platform has given us an opportunity to highlight the exemplary care that our staff provides day in and day out, it has also provided us with an opportunity to identify specific areas of improvement.

The Star Rating is calculated using four quality measures: HIS (Hospice Item Set) data, Hospice Visits in the Last Days of Life (HVLDL), Hospice Care Index (HCI) and Medicare claims data, and the CAHPS Hospice Surveys.

### A. The HIS Comprehensive Assessment Measure at Admission

- The proportion of patients for whom the hospice performed all seven care processes as applicable. Beliefs/values addressed, treatment preferences, pain screening, pain assessment, dyspnea treatment, dyspnea screening, patients treated with an opioid who are given a bowel regimen.

### B. HVLDL

- The proportion of patients who have received in-person visits from a registered nurse or a medical social worker on at least 2 out of the final 3 days of life.

### C. HCI

- A single measure comprising ten indicators calculated from Medicare claims.

### D. CAHPS Hospice Survey

- All eight of the CAHPS Hospice Survey measures.

1. Communication With Family
2. Getting Timely Help
3. Treating Patient With Respect
4. Emotional And Spiritual Support
5. Help For Pain And Symptoms
6. Training Family To Care For Patient
7. Rating Of This Hospice
8. Willing To Recommend This Hospice

With these new changes, we found ourselves needing to enhance our current QAPI program by adding the Quality Ambassador position in May of 2022. The Quality Ambassador works with QAPI on developing ways to improve our Star Rating to 5 Stars (Strive For Five). A Quality Ambassador was chosen for each branch: Crystal Terry, Tyler Bostick, Brooke Walker, Raenette Biedka, & Billie Chord.

The Quality Ambassador’s primary focus has been improving Bella Care Hospice’s CAHPS Hospice Survey scores. This 47-question survey is mailed to the primary caregiver 30 days after the death of a patient. At this time, we have identified “Communication With Family” and “Help For Pain and Symptoms” as two areas that have the most room for improvement.

Some of the tasks that the quality ambassadors have been working on are making additional quality calls to current patients, sending welcome letters to the primary caregiver of new patients, providing education and engagement with fellow staff members, and keeping the QAPI bulletin board updated. Make sure to check them out as they are updated quarterly.

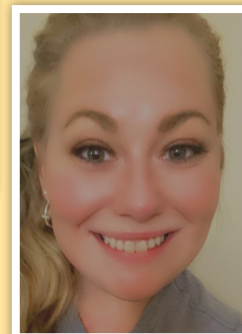


## Welcoming new team members

The Dayton branch is making some new knot blankets to give out to our patients in 2023 with the help of a local school and their wonderful volunteer group!



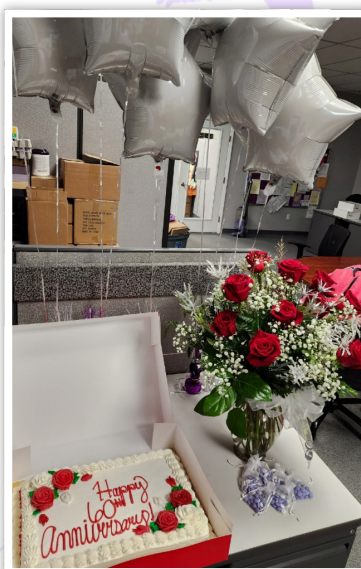

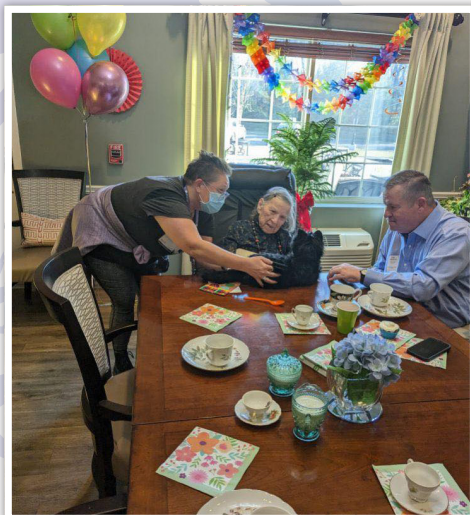
### Birthday Tea

## Columbus Symphony Orchestra

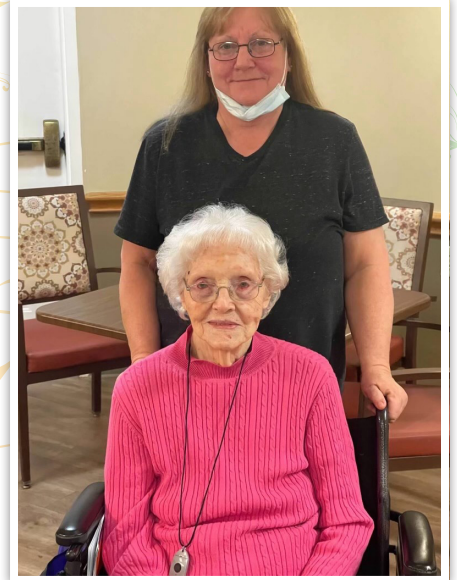
As a social worker for Bella Care Hospice, one of the best parts of my job is planning and executing Celebrate Life events with the help of my amazing team. The Celebrate Life Foundation is a way for us to truly live our mission statement, and it is one of the things that make Bella Care unique. Big or small, each of these events makes a significant impact in the lives of our patients and their families.

Recently, I was fortunate to take part in a truly special occasion for one of our patients. Doris was admitted to our service in September of 2022. When she came on with us, she was overwhelmed by her decline and her admission to hospice, and it caused her a lot of anxiety. When her birthday came around in October, she did not want to have

a celebration. In talking to her daughter, I learned that Doris had at one time been a cellist and enjoyed attending the Columbus Symphony. Due to her anxiety and physical condition, it was no longer a possibility for Doris to go out to a performance, but it got me thinking: what if we could bring the symphony to Doris? On a whim I went to the Columbus Symphony website and after poking around, I found an email address for an outreach coordinator. I sent her a message explaining the situation, and to my surprise she responded the same day to let me know how excited they would be to put on a performance for Doris. I phoned Doris' daughter, who was very excited, and after that it was just a matter of arranging the details. On a Friday afternoon in the first week of December, the Columbus Symphony Orchestra sent three musicians - a violinist, a violist, and a cellist - to the AL to put on a private performance for Doris and some of her fellow residents. Doris attended as the guest of honor, and for the first time since I had met was excited to get dressed up and leave her room. The trio played classical Christmas songs for an hour, and many of the residents sang along. The musicians even spent some time with Doris after the performance

was over. She was practically glowing. A few weeks later, Doris had a sudden change in condition and passed away with her daughter and the hospice team at bedside. Her daughter told us how grateful she was that with the help of Bella Care she had been able to provide that final experience for her mom.

I remember telling the musicians after the performance that afternoon that though the audience had been small, they had made a big impact. As you read this story, remember that it is not just the big events that make a difference in our patients' lives. The little things you do each and every day - a smile, a comforting word, a held hand, a silent presence while someone grieves - mean everything to those we serve.
